### **2024 Austin Utility Rates**

The Austin Utilities Board of Commissioners approved the 2024 rate adjustments at the December board meeting. For 2024, customers can anticipate a 2-4% increase in the electric portion of their bill. The average residential customer will see an increase of \$1.78 per month and small to mid-sized business customers can expect to see an average increase of \$3.58 per month. The increase is caused by wholesale market prices, transmission costs, and substation improvements.

There will be no increase in natural gas rates in 2024. Rate costs for customers will be similar to 2023. AU uses a Purchased Gas Adjustment (PGA) mechanism to address gas increases or decreases on a month-by-month basis if needed.

Water rates will increase 4.5% for all customers. May through October, the average residential customer will see an increase of \$1.20. Small to mid-sized business customers can expect to see an increase of \$3.40 to \$28.80 per month depending on the size of their meter and usage. The need for the rate increase is due to increasing distribution costs and system improvements.

"A rate study will be performed in 2024 by a third-party firm. The rate study helps us plan for future revenue needs and prioritize investments in infrastructure and technology while considering customer affordability," said Mark Nibaur, General Manager.

### 2024 City of Austin Sewer Rate Change



City of Austin residents and businesses will see a sewer rate increase of 10% in 2024. Residents will see an average increase of \$5.25 per month. Rates are increasing to pay for the \$100 million Wastewater Treatment Plant Expansion. Along with the rate increases, the project is being funded by loans, and state grants. The hydrant and stormwater fees will not see an increase in 2024. 

## **Connecting Youth to Careers at AU**

If you are a high school or college student, you may be thinking about what you'd like to do with your future. What career is right for me? Austin Utilities gives opportunities for young adults to learn about careers in the utility industry not only by observing but gaining handson experience.

#### **AHS Mentorship**

We partner with Austin High School's Mentorship program. The student spends 35 hours with a department or an employee to observe and ask questions. To gain the information needed to decide if this career path is what they would like to pursue. Currently, we have two AHS students mentoring with the electric department and with operations.



During construction season, AU offers an electrical internship. The intern candidates go through the job interview process. If selected, that person will complete 1,000 hours of work. The practical experience allows the intern to build their knowledge and grow their skill set.

#### **Summer Work**

Summer job opportunities give high school graduates or college students an opportunity to gain hands-on experience. Many departments within AU have summer employees which provides a variety of work and departments to work with.

These opportunities not only help the participants but have helped AU build a strong workforce. Currently, seven of AU's employees have either participated in our summer workers or intern programs. "All of these opportunities have been a great help for us to build a well-rounded group of line workers. Individuals that have interned and came back to AU have brought back a lot of knowledge. Examples are new construction practices, tools, and materials. We are the most innovated that we have ever been," said Bill Bumgarner, Electrical Distribution Supervisor.
